Who to talk to if I have a query, concern or complaint

We are a growing school, and with the return of Mrs Morton, we have reviewed staff responsibilities so that we have a more manageable, distributed leadership structure that will be able to support you more effectively when you have queries and concerns. We do try to keep our doors open to you, but ask that only quick messages are shared first thing in the morning. This is so that staff can get children into school, take registers and ensure everyone is ready for the first lessons at 9.00.

The gate will be 'manned' by Ms Soulsby and other members of staff—this is so that you get to meet other leaders in school, as well as freeing up some time for Maria to attend meetings and complete other tasks linked to whole school leadership and management.

If you have a concern about your child, you should always contact the class teacher first. They are best placed to answer your questions or address your concerns because they know your child so well. They can also quickly make changes or put in steps to support your child.

If you feel that you need more support or that your child's teacher has not really addressed your concern, then please speak with either **Mrs Morton** (for children in Reception and Years 1 and 2), or **Mr Leach** for children in Years 3,4,5,and 6. This is because they have delegated leadership of these 'phases' in school.

If you feel you have exhausted these channels and need to take your concern further, then you should contact Ms Soulsby.

You can contact us by either telephoning the school office and leaving a message, or emailing the school. We will endeavour to respond to your telephone call or email within 3 school days. Emails are checked every morning, so please be aware that if you send an email towards the end of the school day, this might not be seen until the following morning.

Should you have a safeguarding concern about any child, you can speak to Ms Soulsby, Mr Leach or Mrs Morton, who are all trained at the highest level for safeguarding and are qualified 'Safeguarding Leads' - this means that they have full access to safeguarding information and know how to make referrals to the Local Authority, where necessary. For Safeguarding concerns, we will always prioritise these and will get back to you within 24 hours, and usually before the end of the school day.

Our teachers are not usually available for appointments on Tuesdays, as this is when we have our weekly teacher meetings. Some Wednesdays and Thursdays are also used for teachers meetings.
