This Week at St James'...

If your child vomits at home, you must always keep them off school for at least 48 hours anyway. Thank you so much for your support with this—we need to all work together to try and limit the risks of spreading whichever viruses are present in school.

Many of you will have seen the changes to the office space in the main foyer. Unfortunately, our contractors have messed up a bit and have only completed half the work—things are in hand to finish things off shortly, but it is clear that the final move will be delayed. However, when it does get finished, it will make such a positive difference to the environment.

We have noticed lots of plastic bottles just get thrown on the ground, creating litter, so when we see them, we will pick them up and put them in the bin, bring in the bottle top to our collection. In the main entrance is a big bin, which we'd like to fill with bottle tops in the next few weeks—please help. 
