Road Safety around School

We are becoming increasingly concerned for the safety of all pedestrians around the school site and have noted a few 'close shaves' involving cars and pedestrians.

Particular concern is the staff car park and school drive. A number of children have been spotted crossing the school drive and Nodders Way without stopping and looking for cars. Please ensure that you have close supervision of children when crossing these roads, and take the time to remind your children of safe crossing rules.

In addition, we have noticed a number of children running across the car park to arrive at/leave Before/After School Club. Staff have been advised to stop their car whenever they see any pedestrians in the area. However, the problem we have is that a number of parents are using the car park to pick up/drop off children. We respectfully ask that no parents use the staff car park during the hours of 7.30-6.00. This is to ensure there is limited movement of cars whilst pedestrians are around.

Late Pick-Up

A number of children are regularly being picked up late by parents at the end of the day. We appreciate that there will be times when you are unavoidably delayed, due to traffic problems or other exceptional circumstances. When this happens, please telephone us to let us know and we will happily look after your child until you get here.

However, some parents are repeatedly late, because they don't finish work until 3.30 or because they have other children at different schools to pick up. These are problems which individual parents need to take responsibility for solving, rather than relying on the good will of the staff in school. In some instances, staff have been left supervising children until 3.45, making them late for their meetings and other commitments, and this is not acceptable. In future, any child whose parent is repeatedly late for pick up will be taken to After School Club for supervision and care, for which you will be charged.

Of course, most parents would not dream of being late for their child, and we appreciate your on-going responsibility and support.


