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This week at St James'...

We were really pleased to welcome so many of you into school this week for your parent/teacher consultation meetings. We hope you found these as useful as we do, and that you have a clear understanding of how well your child is doing at school and what their next steps are for the coming terms.

This afternoon, I have a meeting with Governors and our building contractors to finalise the details for the start of our Primary Conversion building project—this meeting marks the culmination of many months of hard work by Governors—hours of time have been spent planning the project, securing designs and contractors, meeting with the Local Authority to secure permissions and funding, liaising with utility suppliers, and more besides. I am truly grateful to our governors—who are all volunteers, most of whom have their own jobs to do as well—who have really put in an incredible amount of work and time to ensure we get a building which will support our growing school. The build is due to start in the Easter holidays, so there will be some disruption over the next couple of months—once we've finalized details, we will obviously let you know.

Next week sees St James' musicians in full performance mode! Kingfishers have been learning to play the ukulele this term, and will be participating in a special Play Day on Tuesday. Canaries and Green Jays have been practicing their singing skills and will be performing at the Corn Exchange on Wednesday. Break a leg everybody (not literally, of course!)! We've also got sport on our minds next week, with Sport Relief, Whinchats & Canaries taking part in a multi-sport event, and our Peacock girls playing in a football tournament. I'm always really pleased that, even though we are quite a small school, we are still able to provide a range of opportunities beyond the statutory curriculum to enthuse and enrich our children, and am grateful to all the staff who make these things happen, the PSA who help to fund activities, and the legion of parent volunteers who help with supervision, transport etc. Thank you!

From the Governing Body

Dear Parents and Carers,

Governor Election Update:

You may recall that just before the half term break, a vacancy became available on the governing body for a parent governor. We had two applicants who were both very knowledgeable and would make a great addition to the team. Since then a second vacancy also became available for a foundation governor, to be appointed by the Diocese of St Albans Education Board.

Considering we had two candidates who were both extremely competent and would make excellent candidates, I approached the Diocese to suggest they appoint one of the parents who wanted to stand in our parent election. I am pleased to report that after much discussion, a thorough application process and a lengthy meeting yesterday evening, the Diocese agreed to appoint. Starting after the Easter Break, the two new additions to the Governing body at St James are Alan Brown and Alistair Fraser. For those of you who do not know Alan or Alistair, more information about them is below:

Alan Brown:

I am the Director of Post 16 studies and Achievement and a member of the senior leadership team at Biddenham International School. I have been teaching for 12 years and before that I worked for the Rugby Football Union as a development officer. A large part of my role within the school is utilising multiple sources of information and data to ensure the positive outcomes for our young people. I work closely with other heads of sixth form in the local area so we can share and collaborate on resources and strategies for improvement. I also currently serve as a member of the PSA.

Alistair Fraser:

I was born and brought up in the Thurleigh, and have lived in Biddenham now for 4 years. My wife Sarah and I have two daughters – Anna (5) in Whinchats, and Poppy (2) who will hopefully join St James' in a couple of years. I trained as a chartered accountant with KPMG and I currently head up the financial planning team in Whitbread plc. One of my key responsibilities is ensuring that the Group understands what the future looks like and that is allocating its resources in the right way. Having come from a family of teachers, I felt the calling of school again, and previously acted as a community governor for Ferrars Infants Academy in Luton, helping the school navigate its way through its new Academy status. I'm therefore passionate about the opportunity to use my financial and prior governor experience, and educational interest, to support not only my community's school, but my children's school.

I would like to thank both Alan and Alistair for their commitment to the school by giving up their own time willingly and for the work they will undertake to benefit all of the children at our school. We on the governing body look forward to working with you both.
