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## This week at St James'...

Oh my goodness, it's Term 6 already, and the year is very quickly running out! Sport has been a theme for the week—on Wednesday, Peacocks competed against other schools in various athletics events, on Thursday our Year 5 girls took part in the District Cricket finals, and today our younger children are taking part in a summer multi-sport festival with other schools from the town. All of which take a great deal of time and energy from staff to organize, and are dependent on parents supporting and helping with supervision—Thank you everyone for your commitment!

On Tuesday, we welcomed our new families to their 'welcome to St James' meeting, ahead of their children starting school in September. If your child is in Year 3, 4 or 5, payment for School meals will be required – please ignore this message if you have already made payments.

Meals are £2.15 per day, £10.75 per week. Payment can be daily, weekly or half termly/termly.

Payment from Tuesday 5th June up until Friday 20th July totals £73.10. If you have paid the full termly amount of £73.10 and your child is off school, whether it is due to sickness or school trip, your child's account will be credited and you will not be charged for that particular day's school meal.

Please send payment in an envelope clearly stating your child's name and amount enclosed. If you are paying by cheque please make cheques payable to Caterlink.

We have been asked to remind all families that Caterlink provide meals on a pre-paid basis only - all meals should be paid for in advance.
