SCHOOL UNIFORM – MAPAC

If your child is in Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 payment for School meals will be required – please ignore this message if you have already made payments.

To clarify, meals are priced at £2.10 per day, £10.50 per week. Payment can be made to your child's online account.

Please make payments via the Caterlink Schools Meals Payment System. Every child who currently pays for a school meal have previously received a letter regarding setting up an account for your child. If you have misplaced your letter please speak to Dawn in the Office to arrange a new letter.

Individual and Sibling Photographs - Thursday 26th September 2019

Every year, we invite a professional photographer into school to take photos of your children. We will be using a company called Tempest to take your child’s photograph on Thursday 26th September 2019. We would also take a photograph of siblings within the school.

The photographs are stored on the photographer’s computer system as digital images, and a paper copy is sent home to you, for the purposes of ordering. We also store digital copies on our school management system in your child’s personal record. We print them only for purposes of supporting your child, for example to share medical information with staff. We do not publish these photos outside of school for any purpose, unless we have your specific approval and consent. Tempest Photography do not share the photos beyond the school.

Birthdays

This is a gentle reminder that due to the amount of children in the school and various allergies and dietary requirements we are unable to hand out sweets or cakes on behalf of the children. Instead, children are able to wear their own clothes to celebrate their birthday. If your child's birthday falls in a school holiday or on a day where the children are already in mufti then you will be able to choose another day to come dressed in their birthday clothes.

Some parents still want to share cakes and sweets; this is something we don't encourage because of the risks involved, but if you wanted to do this with your child outside of the school gates, the school will not prevent this from happening. It is your responsibility to gain consent from parents, and ensure you are aware of allergies and dietary requirements (please note that the school will not provide you with this level of personal information), and that you take appropriate precautions.

Thank you for your support with this approach—we believe this allows children to enjoy their special day, whilst ensuring everyone stays safe.

The National Child Measurement Programme

CALLING ALL YEAR 6 PUPILS WE NEED YOUR HELP!

We want to learn more about how children in England are growing. So we need to measure the height and weight of all Reception and Year 6 children. If you're in Year 6, here's what will happen, it's very easy:

- 1 You'll take off your coat and shoes.
- 2 Stand on the scales to be weighed.
- 3 Stand against the measuring stick so we can see how tall you are.
- 4 Put your coat and shoes on again and go back to your class.

No one will see. You will be weighed and measured one at a time, away from your class. (You can bring a friend if you like.)

No one will know your weight and height. Your weight and height details are just for our National Child Measurement Programme. We won't show anyone else – not even your friends and teachers.

You will only need to take your coat and shoes off – because they are heavy and bulky.

Will everyone see?

Will everyone know my weight and height?

Will I need to take off any clothes?
