Individual and Sibling Photographs - Thursday 26th September 2019

Every year, we invite a professional photographer into school to take photos of your children. We will be using a company called Tempest to take your child's photograph on Thursday 26th September 2019. We would also take a photograph of siblings within the school.

The photographs are stored on the photographer's computer system as digital images, and a paper copy is sent home to you, for the purposes of ordering. We also store digital copies on our school management system in your child's personal record. We print them only for purposes of supporting your child, for example to share medical information with staff. We do not publish these photos outside of school for any purpose, unless we have your specific approval and consent. Tempest Photography do not share the photos beyond the school.

If for any reason you would prefer the school not to take a school photograph, please either write a note and return to the school office or send an email to office@stjamesvaschool.co.uk advising of your wishes. If we do not hear from you we will assume you are happy for photographs to be taken.


Quiet Garden Development Day


