Today, we are all in MUFTI to support our Pupil Governors' charity, Beads of Courage, which supports children who are very seriously ill—thank you for all your donations today.

Next week is our last week of Term 1, and in the run up to half term, there is still lots to do. Quite a few staff will be out of school on various courses, details of which are listed later in the newsletter. I know that staff absence can cause some difficulties for children, and we try to minimize this by covering classes with people who are known to children. Ensuring we provide good quality Professional Development for our staff is incredibly important to us, and we believe that the investment is incredibly worthwhile as it ensures we stay at the forefront of good practice, which, of course, benefits our children greatly into the future.

Finally, a quick note regarding the PSA. Our PSA is working incredibly hard to organize all sorts of events which help raise money for the school, as well as provide social events for both children and adults. They are continuing to raise money for the purchase of new, fantastic, fixed play equipment, as well as provide financial support for all the trips and visits teachers organize. A big project is the upcoming Neon Party (for adults) which should be a fantastic night out for us all—if you haven't bought your tickets yet, please do so soon—this event raised thousands for us last year, and every penny goes towards supporting the children in school, so please do support us with this.

Tomorrow, a group of us are coming together to build some garden furniture out of all the pallets we have collected—if you can join us from 12.00-4.00, please come along—we need your help!


