Well-being Surveys for KS2 Pupils

Bedford Borough Council has invited our school to take part in a series of children and young people's wellbeing surveys involving years 3 to 13.

The survey questions have been designed to gather information on children and young people's attitudes, perceptions and behaviour around key aspects of health and wellbeing. Each survey is age appropriate for each Key Stage (Key Stage 2-5). The surveys will be completed throughout the Spring and Summer Term on-line, in school time and are anonymous (responses cannot be traced back to individual students). The results from the surveys will help inform Children's Services and Public Health in the future commissioning of services to meet the needs of children and young people in Bedford Borough. The data will also help our school to further develop the health and wellbeing provision across our whole school community. This information will assist us in understanding the specific needs of our pupils and enable us to continue to promote positive attitudes and behaviour in order to lead happy, healthy and safe lifestyles.

We value this opportunity and if you are happy for your child to take part you do not need to do anything. If you do not want your child to take part please let your child's class teacher know in writing.

Dear parents,

Re-visit of Bedford Borough Council issued with a written statement of action from Monday 03 February 2020 - 05 February 2020.

Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) will carry out jointly a re-visit of your local area following the previous inspection that took place between 05 February 2018 - 09 February 2018.

The re-visit will evaluate how effectively leaders have addressed the areas of serious weaknesses detailed in the written statement of action (WSOA).

During the re-visit, Ofsted and CQC inspectors will be keen to speak to as many children and young people and their parents and carers as possible, specifically about the weaknesses identified in the WSOA.

How can local children, young people, parents and carers contribute their views during this local area re-visit?

There are several ways in which children, young people, parents and carers from your provision can engage with the re-visit process and contribute their views.

The inspectors will gather the contributions of parents and families through an online survey and a face-to-face open meeting. The focus of the online survey and open meeting will be set by the inspectors and will be based on the WSOA.

 Parents and carers who would like to take part in this survey can follow this internet link: <u>https://www.smartsurvey.co.uk/s/BedfordRe-VisitLASEND/</u>. The survey will open at 12 noon on Monday 27 January and close at 12 noon on Friday 31 January 2020.

Parents and carers can submit their contributions via the online survey using the link provided above.

 An open meeting, which will focus on areas identified in the WSOA, will take place between 13.45pm to 15.00pm on 3 February 2020 at Child Development Centre Hill Rise, Kempston, Bedford MK42 7EB. Details are also be included on the Local Offer <u>localoffer.bedford.gov.uk</u> Details about the local area SEND re-visit will be available on your local authority's website and distributed through the local area's Clinical Commissioning Group/s (CCGs).

Information gathered during the re-visit

During this re-visit, inspectors may collect information about children and young people in the area. They may look at local area records, speak to area officers and leaders at educational settings, and speak to children, young people and parents or carers. No names will be recorded, but some of the information collected may identify a particular child, young person or adult. Ofsted and the CQC will use this information to prepare their re-visit outcomes letter, and for the purposes set out in their privacy notices. No information will be published that identifies any individual in the outcomes letter.

While we recognise that many parents and carers may have views on their experience that extend beyond the focus of the WSOA, we would like parents and carers to understand that the focus of the inspectors during the re-visit will only be the serious weaknesses identified at the previous inspection. The re-visit team will consider how well leaders have addressed each of the areas of serious weaknesses detailed in the WSOA. We will not be able to follow up or comment upon individual cases.
