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## 'A Rainbow will always appear in the clouds'

- The noise! The sounds of enjoyment

I know your children have enjoyed being back in school and we have all been so impressed by their positivity and enthusiasm— thank you for all you've done to help your children return—it's so good to see the rainbow return and be back where we belong!

### **COVID INFORMATION**

Whilst it's good we're returning back to a level of normality, we all need to continue to be COVID-aware—none of us want to see another Lockdown or any sort of school/class closure.

Please remember that no-one displaying symptoms of the virus should come anywhere near school. Also important is that you remember to **maintain social distancing** rules when on or around the school site and that, out of respect for everyone, you **wear a face covering** when on the school site.

Remember that only **one adult should come on site** to collect children, and where younger siblings must accompany a parent, they should be kept by their carers side; older siblings should wait off-site.

Please do not speak with staff at collection times; if you need to speak with your child's teacher, please either email or telephone the school office.

Children should not return to classrooms if they have forgotten something, if it is an urgent item, then please walk round to the school office and a member of staff will recover it for you. This is so we can maintain a one-way system.

**Please adhere to the timings for arrival and pick up,** so that we can reduce the numbers of people entering and leaving the site:

8.40-8.45 Robins, Whinchats and Canaries

8.45-8.50 Siblings

8.50-8.55 Green Jays, Kingfishers, Peacocks, Sabrewings

- 3.25 Robins, Whinchats, Canaries collection
- 3.30 Siblings collection collect youngest child from class, oldest child(ren) from pedestrian gate (if all siblings are in Years 4, 5 and 6, collect them from the class)
- 3.35 Green Jays, Kingfishers, Peacocks, Sabrewings

#### PLEASE DO NOT ARRIVE TOO EARLY OR TOO LATE

Please see the latest letter from the Director of Public Health. In it is information regarding Lateral Flow Testing which is now available for all household with primary, secondary and college aged children, including how you can access these within Bedford Borough. If you use these and test positive, then you and your household must follow self-isolation guidelines and arrange a PCR test.

If your child needs to self-isolate, there are two week remote learning plans on the school website for each class. If you will need these printed, then please contact the school office. If we send home a class, we will endeavour to print these out to come home with each child.
