Sunshine, clouds, rain, hail! Yes, it really is May!

We've had a great week in school and I continue to be so impressed with and proud of your children and their amazing attitudes towards school and their learning—they are working so hard! Everyone seemed to enjoy art day yesterday, using sculpture to express the values contained within our Rainbow Promise and developing key art skills. The stories behind their art work were incredible, showing deep reflection and understanding of our values.

Mr Tapley discovered a robins nest in the school grounds yesterday, which has generated lots of excitement. Ryu and Year 6 are currently working on setting up a camera so that we can track the progress of our eggs without disturbing the family, and yesterday I shared my own personal connection with robins. Robins are said to be messengers from people we love who have passed away, and there is also a story about how the robin got his red breast—a robin perched on Jesus' cross and drops of Jesus' blood fell onto it, making its breast turn red. True or not, robins give lots of people great comfort, so we're going to make sure we look after our robin family. I've set the children a home learning challenge to find out more about robins.

We've just signed up for a new Emotional Literacy programme called Making Me, following a recommendation from one of our parents (thank you!). This programme will help us to equip our children with skills and understanding to manage their mental and emotional needs as they move through childhood into adulthood. All staff have been trained this week, and we will start introducing some of the activities in the coming weeks, and we will hopefully be able to offer a parent workshop at some point in the future. Additionally, Mrs Wilding and Mrs Warren have received training in meeting the mental health needs of children. All this work will mean we are in a good place to support children as we move on from what has been a very strange and challenging time, and make sure we can help children to build back better from the world of Lockdowns.

Yesterday, I was asked to give a presentation about our approach to reading to colleagues from the Schools of Tomorrow organisation—another opportunity to share the good practice at St James'.

Thank you to all of your support this week with regards to the delivery driver who decided to park up on the zig zags and make his delivery whilst your children were leaving school—following your actions, I have received several telephone calls offering apologies, including one from the driver himself. I have accepted the apologies and believe that the situation has been considered very seriously—an important value here is forgiveness; we all make mistakes, it's what humans do, what is important is that we recognise these mistakes, learn from them, resolve to make changes and show humility by saying sorry. Your support was overwhelming—thank you for working with us to insist on making sure every child is safe.

On Wednesday/Thursday, our Muslim friends and families will be celebrating Eid—we wish you all much joy and love at this special time—Eid Mubarak!

The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, is launching a once-in-a-generation review of children's lives.

It's called 'The Childhood Commission' and it will identify the barriers preventing children reaching their full potential and propose policy solutions to address them.

At its heart is 'The Big Ask' – the largest ever consultation held with children.

In this survey the Children's Commissioner is asking children and young people what they think is important for their future and what is holding young people back. The Children's Commissioner will use what children and young people tell her to show the Government what they think and what they need to live happier lives.

It's an exciting opportunity to help us think big and it's a chance for every child in England to have their voice heard.

Using Sculpture to express the values of our Rainbow Promise


