Welcoming Ukrainians to our neighbourhood

An organisation and fund to support Ukrainian refugees settling locally has been set up through St James' Church, Biddenham and Great Denham. The plan is to urgently build an initial emergency fund, to enable a quick response to assist the Ukrainians who are arriving here.

We will be seeing Ukrainian children in our schools, local clubs and neighbourhoods and this will be an opportunity for you to make them feel welcome and to offer equipment, clothes or toys in good condition. The journeys through Ukraine to reach here are terrifying with the risk of violent assault and murder. The loss of their homes and jobs and potentially their fathers and husbands is traumatising. Ukrainians settling here are starting life with virtually nothing, so any financial donations are also greatly appreciated.

Funds raised will be held in a restricted account and will be used only to help meet the many needs of those refugees arriving in Biddenham, Great Denham, St Mary's and wider Bedford for however long our support is required.

Please consider giving to this fund. There are a number of ways you can make a donation:

1. By bank transfer – sending your donation to the following account:

In the reference field please enter "Ukraine" followed by your postcode and house number. Gift Aid will be claimed where possible – adding 25% to the value of your donation.

2. By cheque - payable to "Biddenham PCC".

Please include a note of your name and address so as to allow Gift Aid to be claimed and add "for Ukraine".

3. Place your donation in a yellow Gift Aid envelope (available in St James' church). Please mark the envelope "Ukraine". Donations can be sent to the St James' Church PCC treasurer at 32a Church End, Biddenham, MK40 4AR. Alternatively, donations can be handed to a churchwarden or simply placed in the weekly collection in St James' church. Also you can call 01234 353662 or 07973 264647.

Dear Parent and Carers

As I write this, I fully anticipate that the Secretary of State will give approval for St James' Primary School to join the Diocese of St Albans Multi-Academy Trust on 1st June 2022. It is governors' understanding that all the necessary legal processes have been completed to make this happen. There is no major announcement to accompany this event and staff, children and parents/carers will see very little physical change at all. I am aware that the school sign has already been changed but I believe this was based on the assumption that the transfer would happen on 1st April. At a recent meeting of the governing body and having considered the outcome of the informal consultation process, governors voted unanimously to progress with the conversion, believing it to be in the best interests of all stakeholders, and especially since the recent government White Paper highlights the expectation that all schools will join strong MATs by 2030 at the latest. By choosing to take this move now, we believe it puts the school in a far stronger position than if we were to wait.

COVID Vaccination of 5 to 11 year olds - Update

National experts have advised that parents of children aged 5 to 11 years should be offered the chance to have their child vaccinated. Vaccination is particularly important for children who have health conditions that put them at higher risk from COVID-19.

For most children COVID-19 is a mild illness that lasts a few days, but for a very small number symptoms may be more serious or last longer. Vaccination will reduce the chance of your child suffering from COVID-19, and two doses should give long lasting protection against serious complications of infection – including any future waves due to new variants.

If you wish to bring your 5 to 11 year old child for their COVID-19 vaccination, you can either book on-line through the national booking system: www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination or by calling 119 between 8.00am and 8.00pm every day. Availability is updated frequently so please check this regularly.

The majority of COVID-19 vaccinations for 5 to11year olds are being offered from the large vaccination centres across Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes. Alternatively, you are welcome to walk-in to any of the centres listed on this page on the BLMK website: www.blmkccg.nhs.uk/covid-19/parentguide/.

The following <u>guidance</u> will help you prepare your child for a vaccination. We know that some young children are anxious about needles and we do hope this will help them.



Sunflower Diaries competition for Biddenham Village Show (at St James VA School on Sunday 11th September 2022)

After two years of covid restrictions Biddenham Village Show is back for **September 11th 2022!** This is a village show that has been running since around 1865, so there is a lot of history, and it needs everyone's support to keep it going!

There will be a series of competitions posted throughout the next half term for all age groups of children to enter. The first competition is for everyone!

SUNFLOWER COMPETITION!

Competition rules;

- 1. Plant your sunflower seed (ideally now!)
- 2. Photograph the milestones of your sunflower growing
- 3. Add a few words to your photographs to explain what is happening, where it is growing (your house, grand-parents' house, school etc...) and how high it is reaching.
- 4. Height measurement is from the base of the stem at soil level to the top of the stem (where the stem meets the flower). The stem can be extended to measure the full height of the plant.

Width measurement is the diameter of the seed head over the top of the flower (excluding the petals).

If you would like to email your progress, please ask your parent/carer to email the address below and we will post your updates on the Biddenham show website http://www.biddenhamshow.org/.

By 1st September, measure your sunflower **height** and seed head width by taking a photo with a **tape** measure by the side (a person may be in the photo holding the measure).

(photographs will appear on the website and at the Show, so by emailing you are giving us permission to use your photograph)

Please don't forget to include your school year (or state over 19 if an adult), your name and address in your entry.
