So, it seems that summer has arrived this week—thank you to all of you who have remembered to send children into school with sunhats on and sun cream applied. They have coped well with the rising heat!

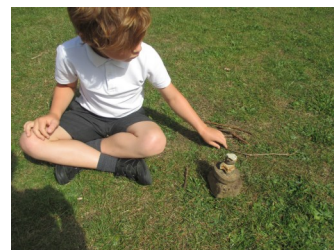
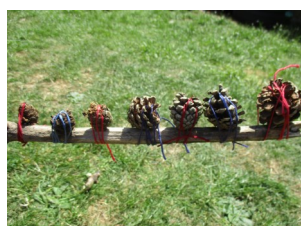

Safeguarding

In the past few weeks, a number of incidents have arisen which have caused us concern from a safeguarding point of view. Please be aware of the following information and take appropriate action to help us keep all children safe from harm:

Smart watches: Children should not wear smart watches to school or bring in any electronic items which have the capability to take photographs or record videos/sounds. Mobile phones are only allowed to be brought into school by older children who walk to/from school, and must be handed in to staff at the start of every day. Any child found with these items during the school day will have them confiscated and they will be returned directly to parents.

Water bottles: these should contain water only. No flavourings such as squash should be in water bottles. No medicines, such as Movicol, should ever be in a child's water bottle, and is incredibly dangerous practice. **All medicines should be brought to school via the school office and a form completed and signed by the parent.** Our policy is that we will only allow prescribed medicines to be administered in school, so if your child does need Movicol, for instance, unless this is prescribed by a doctor, then you will need to administer this at home.

Youtube: there have been a number of behaviour incidents recently, where children have said or done something inappropriate, which they tell us they have seen on Youtube. This includes using unacceptable language, performing adult themed actions, or referring to adult horror films. Once children hear and see this content, it can't be deleted from their brains, it 's there forever.

You must ensure that your child's access to Youtube and other forms of social media and television is monitored and controlled carefully, and you must ensure you know what your child is watching on their tv, tablet or other devices—this is your responsibility as a parent.

If staff are aware of uncensored access to inappropriate material and feel this is harming a child, they are duty bound to report this to the Local Authority Children's Services.

Please find time this weekend to check on what your child is accessing, and set up parent controls on everything; even seemingly benign sites are vulnerable to misuse. Please also include a check on any online gaming sites they may use; children are particularly vulnerable to grooming on these sites.

Sports Day—we walk from school to Biddenham for our sports day. You can either walk with us or meet us all there (it's really helpful if you can walk with us, though). We then walk back to school. Children return to classes for a short spell. We then all go out onto the field for a picnic, which you can join. Children and families can eat together. Bring picnics, blankets, chairs, etc we ask adults not to bring alcohol, though (we are a primary school, after all!).

Proms in the Playground—classes, the choir, and the whole school are learning songs for a special Best of British concert. All children take part in this. This is held outside (so we pray for good weather) and you and your families are the audience. Bring blankets, chairs etc so you're comfortable. It lasts about an hour. Think music festival, but on a much smaller scale!

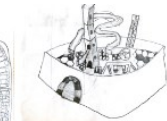

Sunflower Diaries competition for Biddenham Village Show (at St James VA School on Sunday 11th September 2022)

After two years of covid restrictions Biddenham Village Show is back for **September 11th 2022!** This is a village show that has been running since around 1865, so there is a lot of history, and it needs everyone's support to keep it going!

There will be a series of competitions posted throughout the next half term for all age groups of children to enter. The first competition is for everyone!

SUNFLOWER COMPETITION!

Competition rules;

1. Plant your sunflower seed (ideally now!)
2. Photograph the milestones of your sunflower growing
3. Add a few words to your photographs to explain what is happening, where it is growing (your house, grandparents' house, school etc...) and how high it is reaching.
4. Height measurement is from the base of the stem at soil level to the top of the stem (where the stem meets the flower). The stem can be extended to measure the full height of the plant.

Width measurement is the diameter of the seed head over the top of the flower (excluding the petals).

If you would like to email your progress, please ask your parent/carer to email the address below and we will post your updates on the Biddenham show website <http://www.biddenhamshow.org/>.

By 1st September, measure your sunflower **height and seed head width** by taking a photo with a **tape measure by the side** (a person may be in the photo holding the measure).

(photographs will appear on the website and at the Show, so by emailing you are giving us permission to use your photograph)

Please don't forget to include your school year (or state over 19 if an adult), your name and address in your entry.
